“Taste and see that the Lord is good.”

Read: (Psalm 34)

- Q. WHAT one taste truly delights you and WHAT one taste do you most dislike?
- Q. WHY do we taste something before we eat it?
- Q. In WHAT ways would you say you have tasted the goodness of God?

David was on the run when he wrote this Psalm, and you can know what he was up against by reading (1 Samuel chapters 19-21) yet despite his difficulties and dangers he still delighted in the Lord.

- Q. From this one Psalm WHAT do you think left a good taste in the mouth of David and WHY did he have so much do you think to praise the Lord for?

If to ***“Taste and see”*** means *“Try it! You’ll like it!”*

- Q. WHAT are some specific things mentioned in this Psalm that you could try, in order to see if God is good and true to his promises?
- Q. HOW can you tell when a person has tasted the goodness of God? (Consider 1 Peter 2:3)

We are to be **SAVOURING OUR SAVIOUR** this year so we can more get to see just how good the Lord truly is.

- Q. HOW do you think we get a taste for the Lord and WHAT do you think it ought to lead to? (John 6:57)

David began this Psalm with an “I will” statement and follows it up with more of them throughout the Psalm.

Q. As we begin a New Year WHAT might we resolve to have as our own “I will” statements going into it that will give us an even greater taste of the Lord, allowing us to see His goodness to us in even greater measure too?
