EVERYDAY CHURCH FOR EVERYWHERE PEOPLE

(Read Acts 2:40-47)

The Church is the body of Christ. It is made up of all those who place their trust and faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus died to bring us into a living relationship with God. Making Jesus our Lord and Saviour brings us into the body of Christ – THE CHURCH.

Q. IF baptism in water is not necessary for salvation, then WHY did Peter command it for the 3,000 saved on the day of Pentecost? (Vs.42)

Q. WHAT does it mean to continually devote yourself to the apostle's teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread and to prayer? IS that something we still need to be devoted to?

(Vs.43)

Q. HAVE we lost the wonder of doing and being Church?

(Vs. 44)

- **Q.** WHY is togetherness such a vital part of being Church? (Vs.45)
- **Q.** WHY is it important for believers to help and take care of other believers in need?

(Vs.46)

Q. HOW important is it for believers to come together on a regular basis and WHY based on this verse do you think that might be?

(Vs.47)

Q. WHAT does it mean to have favour with all the people, and HOW might that impact our frontlines for Jesus?
